I'm on my knees. At her feet.

Quiet the monster.

More. Mistress.

More.

Find your happy place, Grey.

Make your peace.

Peace. Yes.

No.

A tidal wave rises inside my body, crashing and breaking within me, but as it recedes it sucks the fear away.

You can do this.

I drop to my knees.

I take a deep breath and place my hands on my thighs.

Yes. Peace.

I'm in a landscape of calm.

I give myself to you. All of me. I'm yours to do with as you wish.

What will she do?

I look straight ahead, and I'm aware that she's watching me. In the far distance, I hear her voice.

"Christian, what are you doing?"

I inhale slowly, filling my lungs. Fall is in the air. *Ana.*

"Christian! What are you doing?" The voice is closer, louder, more high-pitched.

Pick up the phone. Bro.
We're worried. Here.

GRACE
Where are you?
Call me. I'm worried.
So is your father.

MIA
CHRISTIAN. WTF.
CALL US. ☹️

ANA
We're at the Bunker Club.
Please join us.
You've been mighty quiet Mr. Grey.
Miss you.

ELENA
Are you ignoring me?

Fuck. Just leave me alone, Elena.

TAYLOR
Sir, false alarm with my daughter.
On my way back to Seattle.
Should be there 3 p.m.

I delete them all. I know I'm going to have to deal with Elena at some point, but I don't feel like it now. I open a spreadsheet from Fred with the cost projections for the Kavanagh contract.

The smell of baking drifts into my study. The aroma is mouth-watering and evokes one of the few happy memories I have of my early childhood. It's a bittersweet feeling. The crack whore. Baking.

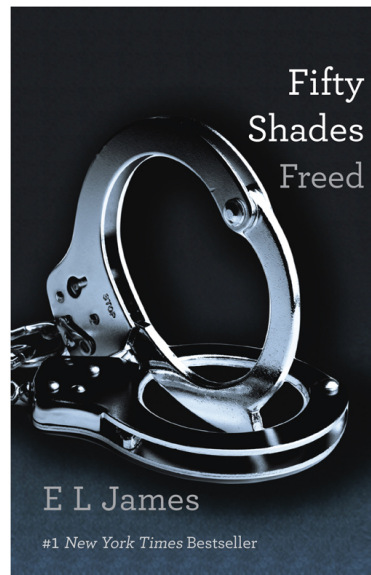
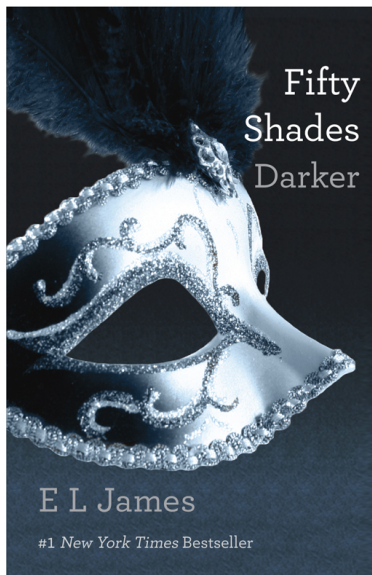
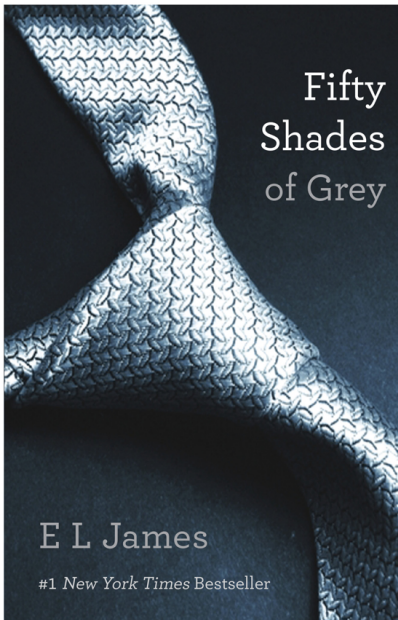
